Ackworth Parish Council Community Day

As the newsletter goes to print we are busy organising the 3rd Community Day. On Saturday 26th October Bell Lane Community Centre opened it's doors for residents to browse information stalls about activities/classes that are run in the village. We worked in partnership with the **Made in Ackworth Art Walk** who also had stalls offering handmade products and residents were given the opportunity to visit working studios around the village.

Ackworth Community Library: Children's Storytime and activities restart on Wednesday 23rd October. Under 5s from 2pm until 2:30pm repeated on Fridays at 10am until 10:30am. 4-11 year olds from 3:30pm until 4:30pm. The Library is also taking part in the Autumn Craft Fair at Ackworth Village Club on Saturday 9th November from 10 to 3.30pm.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATES AND VILLAGE IMPROVEMENTS

Road Safety

The Parish Council's Road Safety Working Group meets bi-monthly to deal with road safety matters within the village. The group carries out reviews, suggests ideas and makes recommendations



to the council. Some of the items currently being investigated include the request for a pedestrian crossing on Wakefield Road, a safe crossing point on Barnsley Road south of the A638, a new chevron sign at the end of Long Lane at its junction with Pontefract Road. Concerns have also been raised to Wakefield Council about the speed limit on the A628 up towards Castlesyke Hill. Additionally Wakefield Council are looking at improvements to the Station Road/ Pontefract Road Junction in Low Ackworth and whilst they acknowledge difficulties in delivering a safer roads scheme to the junction given the existing layout, they have confirmed that there are no plans or intentions to remove the obelisk.

Dando Way Draining Improvements

Ackworth Parish Council are working in partnership with Wakefield Council to improve the drainage between Bell Lane Car Park and Mill Lane. Investigations are being explored to improve the drainage and hopefully work will be completed later in the year.

Tree Survey and Nesting/Bat Boxes

A survey has been carried out on all the

trees on land that the Parish Council is responsible for and work will begin during the winter to make the trees safe and to keep them healthy. We hope to fix nesting boxes for birds and bats in many of the trees at the same time.

Brackenhill Allotments Presentation Evening

The Allotment Association hosted its annual presentation evening on the 18th October. Cllr Amanda Cook presented the awards to the winners of the best kept plots: **Corinne Clarkson and Phil Kinsey, Darren Darley, and Phil and Sue Palmer.** (1st, 2nd 3rd respectively for full plots) **Danny Wong, Keith Hoyle and Alastair Gairns, and Joyce Asquith** (1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively for

half plots). The most improved newcomer was Keith Hoyle and Alastair Gairns. The Champion Vegetables Cup was awarded to **Terry Walker** for the heaviest marrow and The Best Trio of Vegetables Cup was awarded to **Neil Richmond** for his trio of carrots.

Community Litter Picks and New Bins

On the very wet weekend of the 28th/29th September over 60 volunteers took part in 2 litter

picks organised by the Ackworth Big Spring Clean—All Year Round and supported by Ackworth Parish Council and Wakefield Council Street Scene. A staggering amount of



litter was collected. The village schools will be supporting the litter picks over the next 12 months and working to raise awareness of avoiding dropping litter in first place.

In addition to the litter picks, Ackworth Big Spring Clean—All Year round have also arranged through sponsorship; for 12 new bins (The Dirty Dozen) to be placed around the village. The Parish Council have



sponsored this initiative and are also providing a bin to be located near the Youth Shelter adjacent to Bell Lane Car Park.

In other recycling news—a recycling box has been placed at Bell Lane Community Centre near the Library for anyone who wishes to recycle baby food pouches, baby food snack bags or wrappers in partnership with Ella's Kitchen and Terracycle.
