Parish Council—Casual Vacancy John Hardman resigned his position in January. He had been a councillor since May 2019 and is thanked for his contribution. At the community's request an election was called and subsequently held on Thursday 24 March, Mr Stephen Parker was duly elected as Parish Councillor to represent Ackworth Moortop Ward.

Improvements at Low Ackworth

The new permanent bookstore is now sited in the play area, it has certainly been a welcome addition to the village and had proved very popular when it was sited at its temporary location. Thanks go to Clare Wilkinson for her ongoing efforts with this.

A new planter will be soon be installed in the same area along with two new benches. Two existing benches within the play area will be relocated to Carr Bridge.

Additionally, thanks to Ackworth's District Councillors funding from Capital Projects the car park has been extended. This will benefit community centre users as well as those using the playing field. The car park is often used for parents and carers for drop off \ pick up from Howard School too.



Vandalism in our Parish

The purchase of the bin and subsequent repairs has cost over £500.
