The Prince of Wales Memorial

Harry Malkin, renowned artist, Ackworth resident and former Ackworth Parish Councillor specially produced this memorial. "The Prince of Wales Colliery memorial was commissioned by Harworth Estates, the developers of what is now a large housing and parkland complex. They had got in touch with me after seeing the memorial I had made to the miners of Allerton Bywater Colliery that had made such an impression in the locality". In both cases the memorial designs are based on the cage that was used to transfer men and materials hundreds of feet underground. The Prince memorial is made of stone and Coreten steel to be in

keeping with the walls and other street furniture placed around the entrance by the developer. This is a more slender and elegant design than the Allerton Bywater piece though, using profile cut panels of steel to give it a sense of direction and drama. It also conveys the sense the men were "Caged" safe, yet trapped in

a subterranean life we fought hard and long to keep.

It was initially commissioned and accepted about five years ago but these things take time to get from the planning stages to actual fruition. It took in total about two months to make and crane into place.

Set up as a registered charity almost ten years ago following the closure of the local authority library, we are now run by fabulous trustees and volunteers from the village. Ackworth Tennis Club has achieved something unique in the history of the Lawn Tennis Association's National awards: Two awards to the same club in the same year.

Alice Robson (Development coach of the year) and Don Saul (Volunteer of the year) earned a unique triple, double of awards: Yorkshire, North of England and National over recent months.

The LTA made these awards owing to the spectacular progress of the Club.

Chairman, Don Saul stated: "The last rites were being performed over Ackworth tennis club after six years of fruitless attempts to gain members with closure proposed in January 2018. The revitalising of the club came about through the Club entering a partnership with Ackworth School, the Tim Henman foundation, and LTA Yorkshire tennis who agreed to pool funds to obtain a coach and, as a result, we gained, almost, immediate success: within a few weeks there was a 400% increase in membership, an infinite increase in coaching and the anticipation of a bright future."

Head coach, Alice Robson said: "Tennis has always been a massive part of my life, being involved has given me so much joy. My motivation to coach and run a programme is to see the impact that tennis has on other people's lives. To be recognised for something I am so passionate about is incredible with the added bonus to have won the award above coaches who have done astonishing work. I am so proud of Ackworth tennis club, and I am very excited to see what the future brings. We have built a fantastic tennis community and I really hope that continues."

The 'grassroots' success is due, mainly, to Alice, facilitated in her role by Don, and supported by a superb committee. The Club has increased membership by over 1100% and coaching has gone from nil to almost 100 members of all ages being coached each week. Alice has provided outreach into state primary schools: over 2000 pupils in 17 primary schools receive 'six-week introduction to tennis courses' free each year.

Don has agreed a prescription scheme with College Lane surgery to allow patients the choice of being coached or playing tennis, instead of medication. This is stalled, currently, owing to Covid 19.

Don said: "All we had to do at Ackworth tennis club was choose and co-operate with partners, agree aims and obtain the funding. Choose a coach for youthful enthusiasm, enormous potential, a marvellous work ethic, and a capacity to make everyone enjoy their tennis, rather than going for the safe option of experience. Allow her the autonomy to set up and run programmes, trust her to do her job without second guessing her. Have a Chairman and a committee determined to facilitate her needs and ambitions with finance, time and support. Then wait for the results. If only it was as easy as this; we all worked very hard to allow Alice to transform the Club within months, not years; and just look at us now: a diverse, inclusive, vibrant club with a future to match."

Now, in October 2021, 14 months after the awards: the Club has a record membership of over 225, two competitive teams in the Wakefield leagues, three coaches, almost a hundred people being coached each week: everything is going well, and they are looking to the future.




Ackworth Parish Council Wildflower Planting Area
